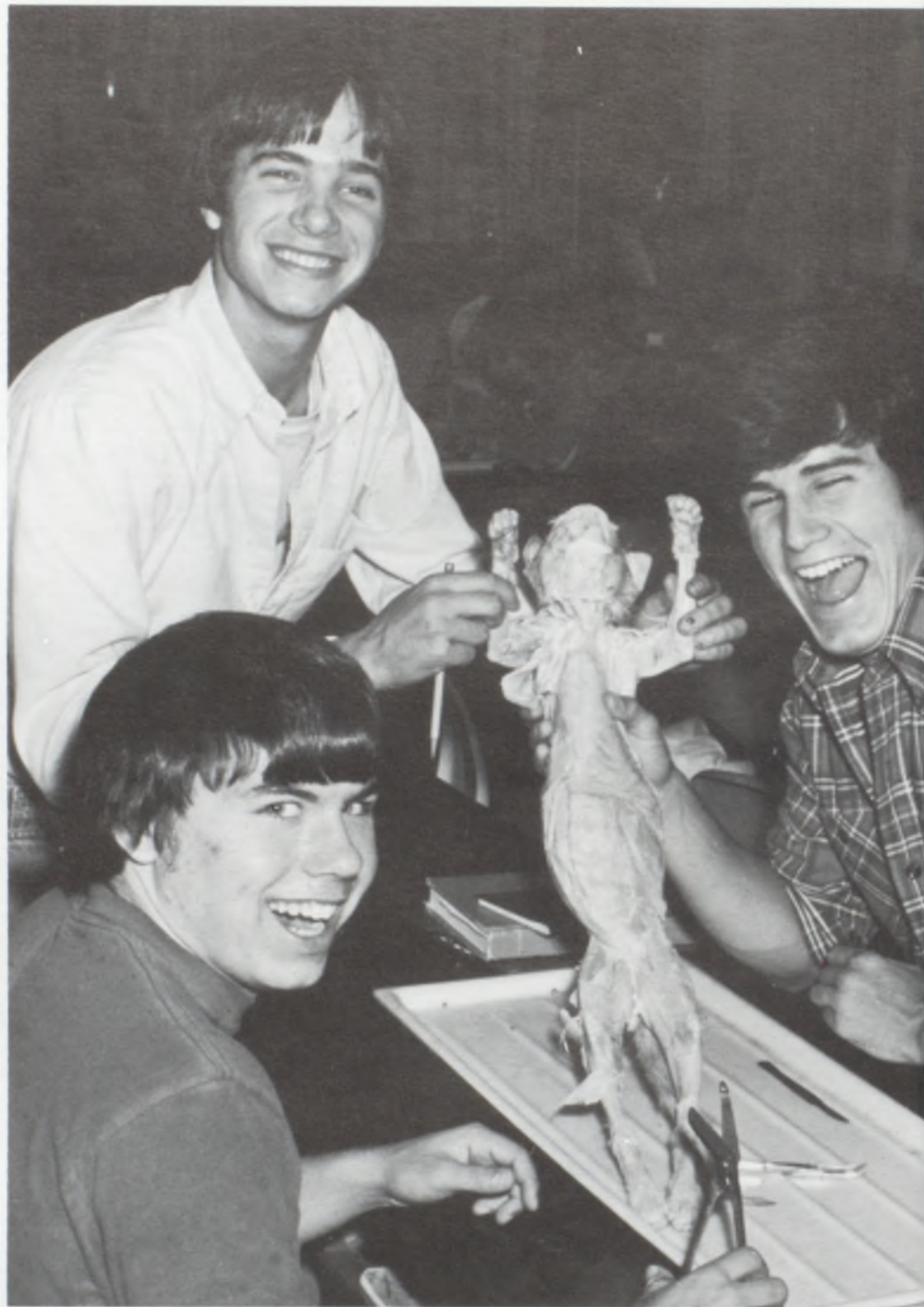
There's More Than One Way to Skin a Cat!

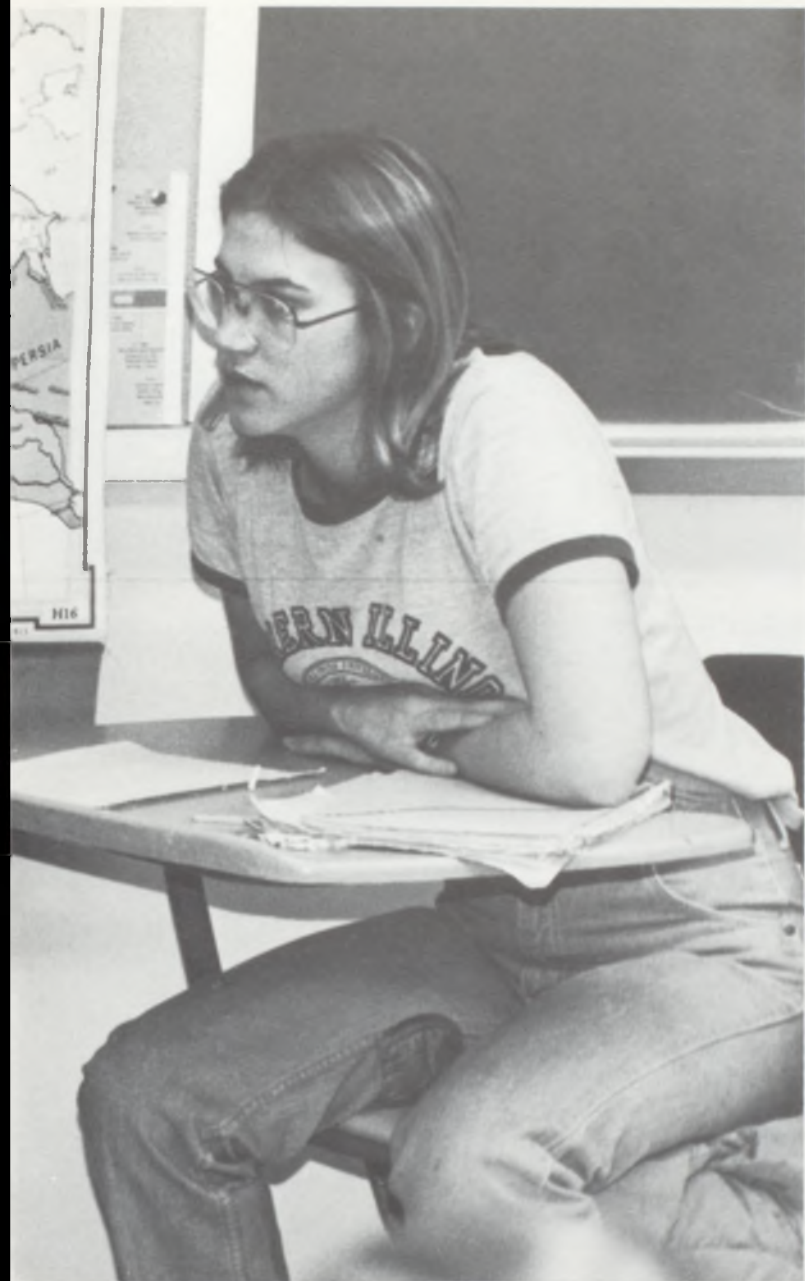
“Social”izing

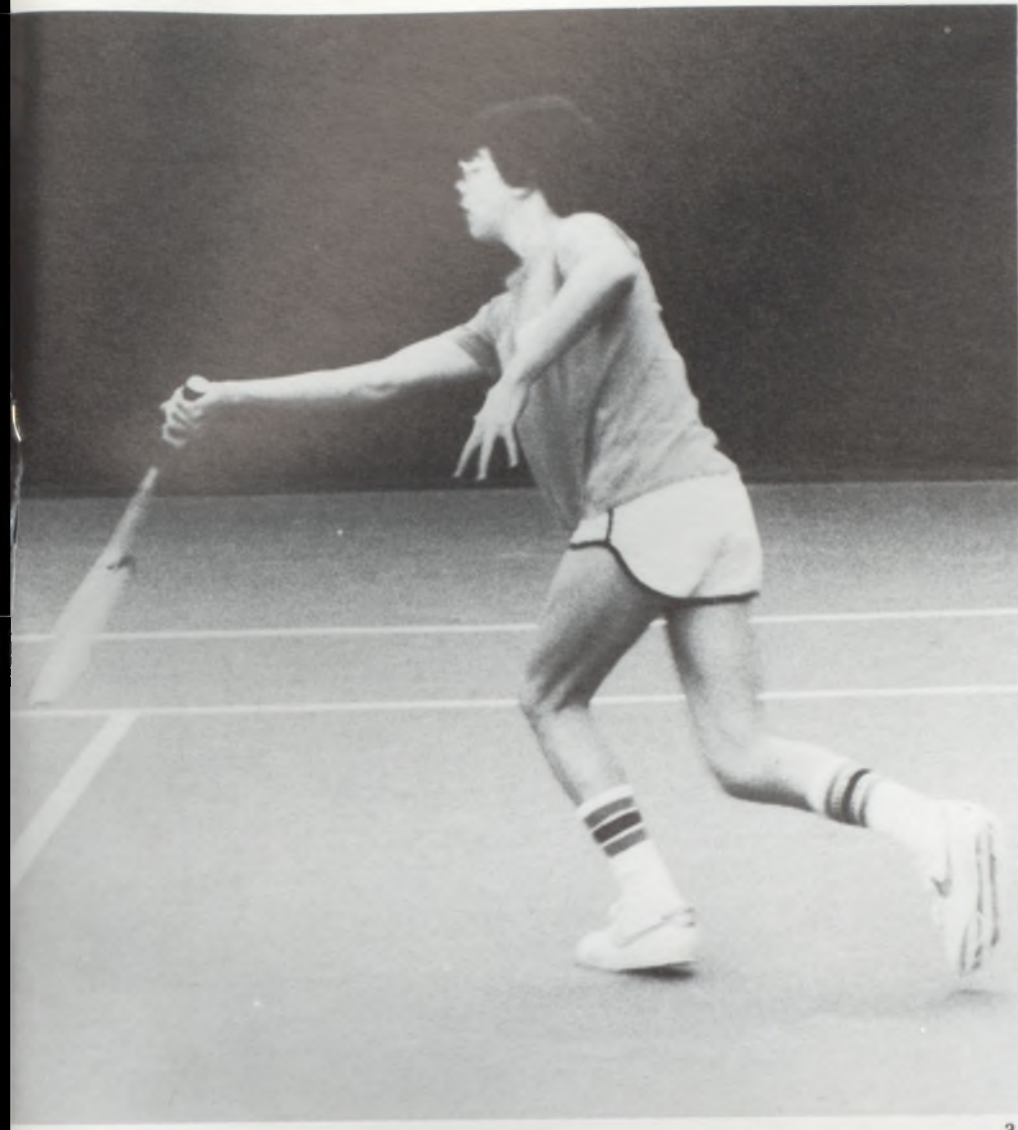


On Your Own



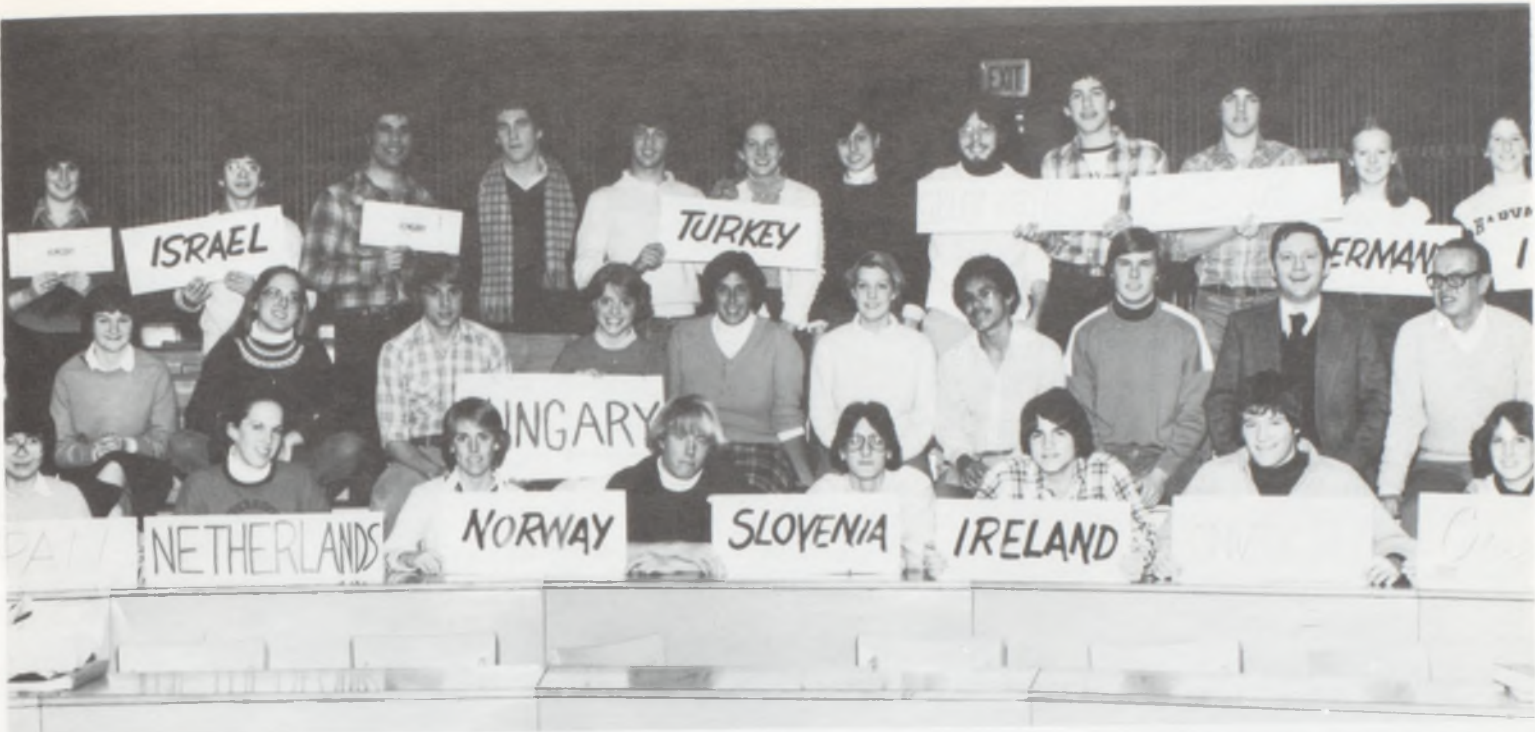
Model U.N.

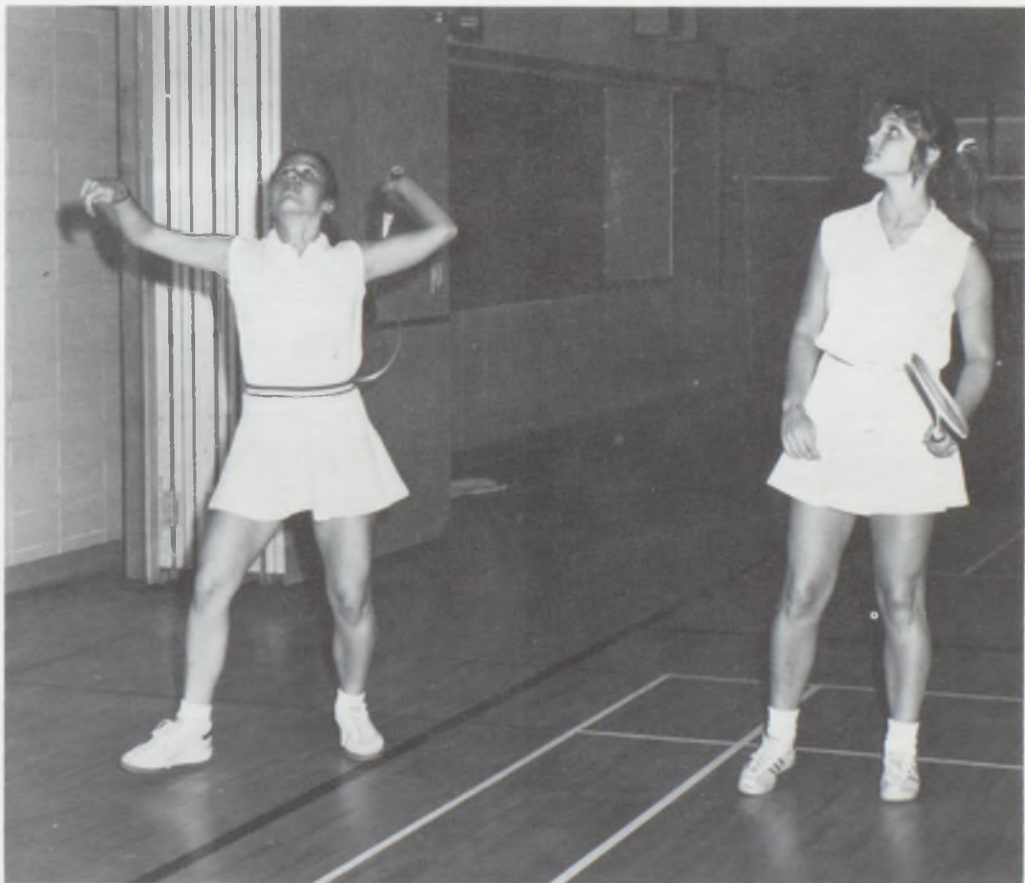
A Smashing Season
