





### Homecoming Dance




Seniors Rosanna Gomez and Mariko Kinoshita explore the unique architecture of Chicago.

Deerfield natives enjoy shopping and exploring virtual activities at Disney Quest. The city atmosphere is both daunting and thrilling.














# Dating







## Creativity



However, even the math and science departments at Deerfield do their best to allow students to explore individually. For example, Dr. Hoyer's AP Environmental Science class does individualized projects third quarter that allow students to explore something of interest to them on a large scale. Jamie Brown, junior, fondly remembers her project which focused on the economic burden of environmental waste when saying, "The individual project allowed me to concentrate on environmental concerns that I thought were important. It really made a difference in my understanding and appreciation for the subject matter." In addition, students are often encouraged to speak their minds in the classroom. Most upperclassman English courses are now almost entirely discussion based. Most students appreciate that freedom and responsibility. Newly created computer graphics courses also allow students to try their hand at a new technological form of art. 






## Student-Teacher Relationships


## Homework




## Resource Centers

Students at Deerfield High School can be seen throughout the day reinforcing what is learned in the classroom in a variety of locations. The library is open before school starts and does not close until 4:00 p.m. which gives students an ample opportunity to check out books, do research, surf the internet or just do homework. Both the listening and speaking labs aid foreign language students in fluency and comprehension. Often students are assigned to watch movies in the lab or take their missed guizzes there. Extra math help is always available before, after, and during school hours in the math lab. For many students, this is the most useful resource center. Many DHS students spend time doing out of class math work in the lab. English students can find much needed help in the WERCS with essay writing and reading comprehension. 


## College








## Treble Ensemble, Concert Choir, Chorale, Choraliers

## Putting on the Show Stunts, Theatrix




## French, Spanish, and National Honor Society


## DECA, Model UN, Student Congress, Troubadour


## WERCS, and Early Bird Tutors Sophomores Mentors




### Senior Advisors Senior PE Leaders
