



















Students in this organization brush up on their knowledge in seven areas: mathematics, chemistry, physics, biology, English, computer graphics, and engineering graphics. 







Model UN members participate in two conferences a year, modeled literally after the United Nations. Each participating school is assigned to represent a country and learn about the specific issues relating to that nation. At the confer ences, students create resolutions and must be prepared to defend and persuade the panel to their nation's side. According to Model UN member Alex Nomitch, the conferences are more than reading and writing papers. "The other kids are the kind of people you really like to be around - people with similar interests. You learn so much about a specific issue - you get to know it really in depth." This year, DHS Model UN participated in the Chicago and Harvard Conferences as Madagascar and Egypt, respectively. The team took away several awards for Best Delegate (Steve Ryan, Harvard Conference), and Honorable mentions at the Chicago conference for eight of the DHS team members. Out of the 150 Nations represented and two thousand students participating, the awards are a rare honor. Very few awards are actually given, decided by a panel of col lege Staff members who act as the Chairpersons and moderators of the event. But awards are not really the goal for these delegates. Alex Nomitch attributes much of the draw to something more - "You learn so much about other people, and learn a lot about diplomacy and interacting with people."














"The team came together and overcame early-season obstacles such as injuries, and we started the competitive season off on the right foot. Eventually girls came back and we
